How does what has happened in Britain relate to what's happening in Kingston?

Ms. Mehra spearheaded the community movement to bring the P3 privatization policy to the public's attention more than a decade ago. She was instrumental in winning disclosure and later an audit by Ontario's Auditor General of the Brampton Hospital P3. She has inspired community referendums in which more than 90,000 Ontarians have voted against P3 privatization. She has led the fight for disclosure of the remaining P3 hospital projects and has written two widely-reported national studies on the issue.
